

THE QUARRY FIRE

We all have a story relating to the Quarry Fire; it's left an imprint on all our minds as we all watched our beautiful canyon ablaze. It was hard to fathom that our homes could actually be gone along with nature's roaming splendor we've all come to admire.

As we monitored the fire from our hotel room, my many drives through "the prayer canyon," as I have come to call it, kept running through my mind. I wondered if I appreciated it enough. Did I memorize every beautiful detail of the canyon? Will it still be there for us when it was all over? Will the animals be okay and return to their homes? Will our home and beautiful surroundings survive? Will Sampson School survive?

Earlier in the day of July 31, I was driving home on Valley Road when a beautiful mama bear and her two tiny cubs suddenly appeared at the side of the road. Red and I stopped and watched in awe for several minutes as the small family made their way back up the big hill. I was on such a high…never before have I seen such young cubs in the wild. They were so cute and precious!!! One was not minding mama very well and took his time in the middle of the road, but she eventually persuaded him to follow. Then, in mere hours, all was threatened…and that's when a large group of amazing people showed up and answered the call. Their heroic efforts of endurance and strategy saved lives, our homes, our beautiful forest and canyon. With fierce determination and knowledge, they used their talents and strength to battle what looked to be complete devastation. But they won. Truly, these are special people and we hold them all deeply in our hearts. Thank you seems so small for what they did for us, but *Thank You* to all who joined in the huge effort that saved so much! Additionally, thanks to The Red Cross, Saucy's Pizza, Moose Hill Cantina, and other donators for bringing in great food for the evacuees!

It's encouraging to see so many people come together in the midst of trouble. Thank you all for being great neighbors and for looking out for each other and helping with animals. I've heard great stories of strangers helping strangers, neighbor helping neighbor. Personally, a lady named Bridgette, came to the shelter and offered her back yard for my big dogs to run. The kindness that pours from strangers grips me. I'll always remember the great support and generosity given to us and I'll pay it forward in any way I can.

And while we're on this subject, be sure to establish a phone tree in your neighborhood. It's helpful to have those numbers ready on a predetermined contact list in case of any emergency. After this past evacuation process, this handy idea came to mind, and an evac plan is a good thing to practice and polish, as well!

So after all this, we know we live in a wonderful community and some really great people had our backs! See ya at the Pig Roast!
